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What Is Your Clothing Budget?

For most youth this can vary. Either you have a part-time job, or your parents help you with your clothing purchases every year. The money you earn or receive will determine how much you have available to spend.

Complete the Clothing Inventory Chart on page 5 to help you figure out what clothes you need to replace or clothing you might need for special occasions.

Determine Your Budget

Look back a few months, say 6 months, and determine how much money you have spent on clothing. This will give you an idea of your history and you will be able to find the cost average per month. Example: I spent \$50.00 in 6 months.

- \$50.00 divided by 6 = \$8.33 per month
- Multiply the average per month by 12. $\$8.33 \times 12 = \99.96 (So let's say \$100.00 per year.)
- Divide that number by your yearly income to find out what you have been spending.
- Decision now is, can I afford to spend the same amount of money or do I need to reduce my budget.
- Use the budget chart below to determine what you can purchase. List the garments in the chart below from most to least needed.

Choosing a Thrift Store or Stores

- Make a day of visiting all the shops in a specific area or around town. Might have to go out of town if you don't have any thrift stores.
- 2. Each store will have a slightly different kind of stock, so take a grand tour and take it all in.
- 3. Keep track of items they carry and if they are in your size.
- 4. What days of the week do they run discounts?
- 5. Ask what's on sale when you enter the store.
- 6. Find out if the store supports a mission and who they are.
- 7. Be nice to people who work in the stores. They are not usually paid very well or not paid at all.

Know What Your Needs Are

- 1. Use the list from you Budget Chart for deciding on what clothing purchases you want to look for on a given day. (Remember to check what days are good bargains for certain clothing in the store.)
- 2. Be creative and keep your eyes (and mind) open for clothing or accessories that might fill a need or a want from your list.
- 3. Select items to create an outfit or outfits you like and that are most suited for the occasion you had plans for.
- 4. Always check the labels to find out how the outfit is to be cleaned. The cost will be higher if it has to be dry cleaned.
- 5. Most thrift stores do not have ample dressing rooms, so when you go shopping wear clothes that you can slip other clothing over to see if it fits appropriately.
- 6. Take an inventory of the clothing you are looking at to make sure it is of good quality (no stains, tears, etc.) It might not be repairable. Don't just buy it because it's a good deal.
- 7. Determine if the outfit is in your budget prior to purchasing the item.

Give Back

- Don't forget to drop off the things you no longer use or need at the thrift store.
- Volunteer to work at a thrift store. Most of them support a mission. Do a good deed!
- Don't try to bargain, chances are you're already getting a good bargain. If it does seem overpriced, ask to speak with a manager.
