## Youth Livestock Safety

Livestock represent a major source of injury to youth, accounting for at least one in five nonfatal injuries to children every year. Young people who show livestock generally spend a great deal of time with their animals and may be at greater risk of injury. This information is designed for use by youth who raise and show livestock competitively and the adult advisers who guide them. Injury prevention and awareness of livestock-related injuries are our goals.
